## Ontario Votes To Keep Investing in Critical Infrastructure to Support Ontario's Economy

**Vaughan, Ont.** – The people of Ontario renewed the Government's mandate to build critical infrastructure in the province. Advancing Highway 413, the Bradford Bypass, the Ontario Line, and investments in housing-enabling infrastructure received strong support from voters in a historic third consecutive majority win for the Progressive Conservatives.

The Residential and Civil Construction Alliance of Ontario (RCCAO) is encouraged by this result, and given the economic uncertainty emanating from the United States, is ready to work with governments and partners to expeditiously advance infrastructure projects to strengthen Ontario's economy.

"RCCAO congratulates the Ontario PC Party and all MPPs elected to Queen's Park to serve the people of Ontario on their win," said Nadia Todorova, Executive Director of RCCAO. "In these uncertain times, with the looming threat of U.S. tariffs, the need for strong leadership has never been greater. Ontario needs a government with a clear plan to continue building and strengthening the economy."

While challenges remain to improve the regulatory environment in the construction industry across the province, RCCAO endorsed the Ontario PC Party in this election given what was at stake for Ontario's future.
