

Caledon property tax increase is 1.13 per cent, about \$59 per household

Includes Peel Region's 2021 tax levy for Caledon residents

Caledon residents will see a property tax increase of 1.13 per cent overall, which is about \$59 for a typical household.

The increase for the town's 2021 tax levy is 1.34 per cent, which is about \$32.49 per year for a typical residence; the region's 2021 tax levy for Caledon residents is 1.50 per cent, which is about \$26.62 per year for a typical residence. Both of which equal the overall tax increase.

This increase is part of the 2021 budget that was approved on Feb. 16.

Some of the budget highlights include \$30 million for the Roads Capital Program, \$1.8 million for the Bridge Capital Program, \$3.1 million for improvements to parks, and \$800,000 to expand Palgrave, Mono Mills and Alton Fire Stations.

"Our focus this year is on people, community and recovery," said Caledon Mayor Allan Thompson in a media release. "This means that the best thing we can do for residents and businesses is maintain service levels and keep our infrastructure in a state of good repair."
